High performance ceiling fan moves 25 percent more air

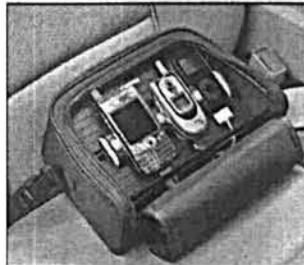
